**DECISION:**

The Tribunal reserved its decision.

The Tribunal will reconvene on May 24, 2012.

**The following written decision was received on May 7, 2012, with Tribunal Member Diane Hall dissenting:**

Only Corporation Nos. 1, 2, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 11 were named in the referral letter, so we have no jurisdiction to deal with Nos. 3, 4<sup>1</sup>, 5, 10 and 12. To these, we apply a simple standard; did the corporation break the law? Corporations No. 2 Great Tasting Sausage Corp. and No. 8 Lidia Ivanova Inc. did and will go to the Penalty phase. No 7 is the call-in with no evidence tendered. It does not go to the Penalty phase. As of Feb. 7, 2012 (referral letter) or April 20, 2012 (second hearing date), No. 9 Big Bite Sausage Corp.'s five charges are still pending, and on the totality of the evidence, we are not prepared to send it to the Penalty phase. Nos. 1 and 6 (Hello and Beefeater's) did not break the law, and neither did its controlling mind. They also do not go to the Penalty phase.
