BY-LAW -2017

To amend City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 169, Officials, City, by deleting the Chief Corporate Officer and the Deputy City Manager and Chief Financial Officer, and adding the Chief Financial Officer, and the Deputy City Manager, Internal Corporate Services.

The Council of the City of Toronto enacts:

- 1. The City of Toronto Municipal Code, Chapter 169, Officials, City, is amended by deleting § 169-1.C. and substituting the following:
 - C. The City Manager is assisted by three Deputy City Managers and a Chief Financial Officer.
- 2. The City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 169, Officials, City, is amended by deleting § 169-10 and substituting the following:
 - "As designated in writing from time to time by the City Manager, a Deputy City Manager or the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to act in the place of the City Manager when the City Manager is absent from the City Manager's duties due to travel, illness or otherwise."
- 3. The City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 169, Officials, City, is amended by deleting Article III and substituting the following:

ARTICLE III

Deputy City Manager, Internal Corporate Services, Chief Financial Officer, and Treasurer

§ 169-17. Deputy City Manager, Internal Corporate Services, responsibilities.

The Deputy City Manager, Internal Corporate Services, is responsible for the internal corporate services at the City and shall perform the duties and exercise the responsibilities that are assigned to the Deputy City Manager, Internal Corporate Services by the City Manager and Council.

§ 169-18. Chief Financial Officer, responsibilities.

In addition to the duties imposed on a treasurer under the *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, other legislation and City by-laws, the Chief Financial Officer is responsible for the financial management and affairs of the City and shall perform the duties and exercise the responsibilities that are assigned to the Chief Financial Officer by the City Manager and Council.

§ 169-19. Treasurer, responsibilities.

In order to permit the Chief Financial Officer to focus on corporate finance, financial planning, and finance and administration, the person appointed to the City's management position of Treasurer:

- A. Is appointed as deputy treasurer under section 138 of the City of Toronto Act, 2006; and
- B. Reports to the Chief Financial Officer, and shall perform the duties and exercise the responsibilities that are assigned to the Treasurer by the City Manager, the Chief Financial Officer and Council.

§ 169-20. Additional duties and responsibilities.

The Deputy City Manager, Internal Corporate Services, the Chief Financial Officer and the Treasurer shall carry out such additional duties and exercise such additional responsibilities as Council may from time to time prescribe.

4. The City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 169, Officials, City is amended by deleting Article XIV.
