CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 29-1998

**To appoint and delineate certain duties and responsibilities of the
City Solicitor for the City of Toronto.**

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. Harry William Osmond Doyle is hereby appointed City Solicitor for the City of Toronto for a term expiring 3 years from the date this by-law comes into force.
2. In addition to all duties imposed upon the City Solicitor by the Municipal Act and any other statutes and all amendments thereto, and by any by-law of the Council, the City Solicitor shall have full charge and control of and be fully responsible for the conduct of the Legal Department for the City.
3. The City Solicitor shall possess all of the duties and responsibilities of the Solicitors for the former Cities of Etobicoke, North York, Toronto, Scarborough and York, the Borough of East York and The Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto.
4. The City Solicitor shall carry out such additional duties and exercise such additional responsibilities as Council may from time to time prescribe.
5. Where this by-law conflicts with the provisions of any other by-law setting out the powers and duties of a municipal official, this by-law prevails to the extent of the conflict.
6. By-law No. 70-89, being a by-law "To appoint a Metropolitan Solicitor for The Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto" enacted by the council of the former Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto is repealed.
7. This by-law shall come into force on the date of its enactment.
