BY-LAW No. 224-1998

To amend further Metropolitan By-law No. 32-92, respecting the regulation of traffic on former Metropolitan Roads.

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. Schedule VI (Prohibited Pedestrian Crossings) of By-law No. 32-92, as amended, is further amended by inserting the following words and figures in Columns 1 and 2 of the said Schedule:

(In Column 1) (In Column 2)

Dundas Street West Between the west curb line of Dunbloor Road and a point 30.5

(M.T. 8) metres west thereof

2. Schedule XIII (One-Way Traffic Lanes) of By-law No. 32-92, as amended, is further amended by inserting the following words and figures in Columns 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 of the said Schedule:
