CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 717-1998

To provide for exemptions from parking restrictions in that area of the City comprising the former City of York.

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. In this by-law,

"City" means the City of Toronto;

"Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Works and Emergency Services for the City;

"Permit" means a permit to park a motor vehicle of a class specified in section 2 hereof on the street or part of the street designated on the permit during the times authorized by this by-law;

"Street" means any public highway or part of a public highway under the jurisdiction of the City.

2. The class or classes of motor vehicles for which a permit may be issued under this by-law are:

- (a) passenger motor vehicles, except motor homes and motorcycles;
- (b) vans, panel trucks and pick-up trucks registered with the Province as PUO (personal use only) vehicles; and
- (c) vans, panel trucks and pick-up trucks commercially registered with the Ministry of Transportation having a registered gross weight of 3,000 kg or less.

3. The Commissioner is hereby appointed as the officer of the City to issue permits on behalf of the City pursuant to the provisions of this by-law, and any permit or renewal of a permit may be issued on the direction of the Commissioner.

4. A permit may be issued pursuant to this by-law only in relation to a residential property which has one or more on-site parking spaces none of which can be used for the parking of motor vehicles due to the obstruction caused by a City-owned tree.

- 5. A permit under this by-law shall not be issued,
 - (a) for any street or part of a street designated in Schedule "A" to chapter 985 of the City of York Municipal Code as a street in relation to which permits may be issued for the overnight parking of motor vehicles;
 - (b) for any portion of a public highway designated as a connecting link or extension of the King's Highway under subsection 21(1) of the Public Transportation and Highway Improvement Act.

6. A permit issued pursuant to this by-law authorizes the vehicle for which the permit is issued to be parked on the street at the location specified in the permit for any length of time despite the three hour parking restriction set out in Paragraph 19(e) of City of York By-law Number 2958-94 and despite any other restricted time regulation established by by-law and posted.

7. The owner and operator of the vehicle to which a permit under this by-law is issued is subject to all parking restrictions, regulations and prohibitions established by provincial statute or municipal by-law and applying to the location specified in the permit, other than

- (i) the three hour parking restriction established by Paragraph 19(e) of City of York by-law Number 2958-94; and
- (ii) any other restricted time regulation established by by-law and posted..

8. The lawful directions of a police officer for the regulation of traffic shall be obeyed despite any provision of this by-law.

9. An application for a permit under this by-law shall contain the following information:

- (a) the name and address of the registered owner of the motor vehicle;
- (b) the licence number, make and year of the motor vehicle; and
- (c) the location of the City tree which obstructs or interferes with access to off-street parking at the property where the owner of the vehicle resides.

10. Every permit issued pursuant to this by-law shall contain the number of the permit, the licence number of the vehicle, the location where the vehicle may be parked, and the month and year of expiry of the permit.

11. All permits shall be numbered consecutively and may be numbered consecutively with permits issued pursuant to Chapter 985 of the City of York Municipal Code.

12. A permit shall be valid for a period of one year.

13. While a vehicle is parked pursuant to a permit issued pursuant to this by-law, the permit form shall be placed on or affixed to the vehicle in the position designated by the Commissioner.

14. The Commissioner may at any time revoke or cancel any permit issued pursuant to this by-law.

15. This by-law applies to that area of the City comprising the former City of York.
