CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 894-1998

To provide for the designation of portions of highways as community safety zones.

WHEREAS subsection 214.1(1) of the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.H.8, as amended, provides that a municipal council may by by-law designate a part of a highway under its jurisdiction as a community safety zone if, in the council's opinion, public safety is of special concern on that part of the highway; and

WHEREAS subsection 214.1(3) of the Highway Traffic Act provides that the by-law or regulation designating a community safety zone shall specify the hours, days and months when the designation is in effect; and

WHEREAS it is deemed by the Council of the City of Toronto that public safety is of special concern on the part(s) of the highway(s) designated in Schedule I to this By-law as community safety zones;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

- 1. When any City of Toronto road or portion of road as set out in Columns 1, 2, and 3 of Schedule I to this By-law has been marked to comply with the Highway Traffic Act and the regulations made thereunder, said road or portion of road shall be designated as a community safety zone within the meaning of section 214.1 of the Highway Traffic Act.
- 2. The Schedule referred to in this By-law shall form part of this By-law and each entry in a Column of such a Schedule shall be read in conjunction with the entry or entries across therefrom and not otherwise.
- 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this By-law is guilty of an offence and on conviction is liable to a penalty as outlined in the Highway Traffic Act.
- **4.** Where this by-law conflicts with any other By-law of the City of Toronto, this By-law prevails to the extent of the conflict.
 - **5.** This By-law shall be deemed to have come into force on January 1, 1999.
