BY-LAW No. 23-1999

**To amend further Metropolitan By-law No. 148-70 respecting
the regulation of traffic on certain former Metropolitan Toronto highways
during periods of emergency occasioned by the fall of snow.**

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. By-law No. 148-70, as amended, being a by-law “To regulate traffic on certain highways during periods of emergency occasioned by the fall of snow” is hereby further amended by inserting a new subsection 2.1 following Section 2, as follows:

“2.1 Despite Section 2 of this By-law, the Mayor may declare that an emergency condition exists on any highway set out in Schedule “A” to this By-law when such a significant amount of snow has fallen that the clearing of snow from the highway is impeded by traffic and parking on the highway.”;

2. The said By-law is hereby further amended by inserting a new subsection 3.1 following Section 3, as follows:

“3.1 The declaration of the emergency condition as provided for in Section 3 can be extended by the Mayor for any further period of time required for clearing snow from the highway.”;

3. The said By-law is hereby further amended by deleting the phrase “Chairman of the Metropolitan Council” where it appears in Sections 2, 3 and 4 thereof, and substituting therefor the word “Mayor”.
