**CITY OF TORONTO**

**BY-LAW No. 776-1999**

**To amend City of Toronto By-law No. 530-1999, being a by-law  
“To Provide for Snow and Ice Removal.”**

WHEREAS it is desirable to clarify City of Toronto By-law No. 530-1999, being a by-law “To Provide for Snow and Ice Removal”, to provide an exclusion to the offence provided in Subsection 2(1); and

WHEREAS it is desirable to have reference to the Provincial Offences Act in the general penalty provision section of City of Toronto By-law No. 530-1999;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

**1.** City of Toronto By-law No. 530-1999, being a by-law “To Provide for Snow and Ice Removal” is amended by adding a new Subsection 2(3) after Subsection 2(2) as follows:

“(3) Subsection 2(1) does not apply to an owner or an occupant of a building where, pursuant to City of Toronto policy, the City of Toronto has undertaken the responsibility to clear away and completely remove snow and ice from the sidewalk on the highway in front of, alongside, or at the rear of the building at that location”.

**2.** Subsection 6(1) of City of Toronto By-law No. 530-1999, being a by-law “To Provide for Snow and Ice Removal” is amended by deleting: “Any person who contravenes any provision of this By-law is guilty of an offence.” and inserting in lieu thereof: “Every person who contravenes any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and on conviction is liable to a fine as provided for in the Provincial Offences Act”.
