CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 826-1999

To establish certain lands as a municipal highway.

WHEREAS the City has acquired certain lands as hereinafter described and the Council of the City deems it appropriate and necessary to accept the said lands as a Public Highway; and

WHEREAS subsection 1(a) of Section 297, of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M.45 provides that the Council of every municipality may pass by-laws for establishing and laying out highways; and

WHEREAS subsection 111 of Section 210, of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M.45 provides that by-laws may be passed by the Councils of local municipalities to provide for surveying, settling and marking the boundary lines of highways and give names to them.

Now, therefore, the Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. The lands described as Part of Lot 10 in Concession 1, designated as Part 1 on Reference Plan 66R-17339, in the City of Toronto (formerly City of Scarborough), more particularly described in Schedule attached hereto, which forms part of this By-law, are hereby established and laid out as a public highway within the City to be known as Old Kingston Road.

2. All By-laws presently in force with respect to highways and streets shall apply to the said highway created under this By-law.
