**CITY OF TORONTO**

**BY-LAW No. 364-2000**

**To amend current City of Toronto By-laws No. 30742 (North York), No. 22614 (Scarborough), No. 107-86 (Metro), No. 197 (East York), No. 1645-89 (York), and Municipal Code Chapters 400 (Toronto), 982 (York) and 187 (Etobicoke) respecting the use of parking meters to establish new regulations for the parking of motorcycles in metered spaces.**

WHEREAS City Council has adopted the recommendation of the Chair, Toronto Parking Authority, that City by-laws respecting parking meters be amended to provide for the parking of motorcycles in parking spaces controlled by a parking meter;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

**1.** By-law No. 107-86, being “A By-law Respecting Parking Meters on Metropolitan Roads”, of the former Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto, is amended by adding the following clauses to Section 7:

- (d) Despite anything else in this Section 7, up to three motorcycles may be parked in a parking space, provided that no person shall park a motorcycle in a parking space at an angle greater than forty-five (45) degrees to the curb, and Section 4 shall not prevent the driver or operator of a motorcycle parked as required under this Subsection 7(d) from using the unexpired time remaining on the parking meter from its previous use without depositing a coin in the meter.
- (e) No person shall:
  - (i) park a motorcycle in a parking space occupied by an automobile or more than two (2) motorcycles; or
  - (ii) park an automobile in a parking space occupied by a motorcycle.
- (f) For the purposes of this section, “motorcycle” means a self-propelled vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the driver and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, and includes a motor scooter or other similar two-wheeled motor vehicle.

2. Chapter 400, Traffic and Parking, of the Municipal Code of the former City of Toronto, is amended by adding the following clauses to Subsection 400-42H:

- (4) Despite anything else in this § 400-42, up to three motorcycles may be parked in a parking space, provided that no person shall park a motorcycle in a parking space at an angle greater than forty-five (45) degrees to the curb, and Subsection 400-42D shall apply to the use of the parking space by motorcycles under this Subsection 400-42(H)(4).
- (5) No person shall:
  - (i) park a motorcycle in a parking space occupied by an automobile or more than two (2) motorcycles; or
  - (ii) park an automobile in a parking space occupied by a motorcycle.
- (6) For the purposes of this section, “motorcycle” means a self-propelled vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the driver and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, and includes a motor scooter or other similar two-wheeled Motor Vehicle.

3. By-law No. 30742, being “A By-law Respecting Parking Meters on the City of North York Roads”, of the former City of North York, is amended by adding the following clauses to Section 4:

- (d) Despite anything else in this Section 4, up to three motorcycles may be parked in a parking space, provided that no person shall park a motorcycle in a parking space at an angle greater than forty-five (45) degrees to the curb, and Section 3 shall not prevent the driver or operator of a motorcycle parked as required under this Subsection 4(d) from using the unexpired time remaining on the parking meter from its previous use without depositing a coin in the meter.
- (e) No person shall:
  - (i) park a motorcycle in a parking space occupied by an automobile or more than two (2) motorcycles; or
  - (ii) park an automobile in a parking space occupied by a motorcycle.
- (f) For the purposes of this section, “motorcycle” means a self-propelled vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the driver and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, and includes a motor scooter or other similar two-wheeled motor vehicle.

4. By-law No. 22614, being “A By-law Respecting Parking Meters on Scarborough Roads”, of the former City of Scarborough, is amended by adding the following clauses to Section 6:

- (d) Despite anything else in this Section 6, up to three motorcycles may be parked in a parking space, provided that no person shall park a motorcycle in a parking space at an angle greater than forty-five (45) degrees to the curb, and Section 4 shall not prevent the driver or operator of a motorcycle parked as required under this Subsection 6(d) from using the unexpired time remaining on the parking meter from its previous use without depositing a coin in the meter.
- (e) No person shall:
  - (i) park a motorcycle in a parking space occupied by an automobile or more than two (2) motorcycles; or
  - (ii) park an automobile in a parking space occupied by a motorcycle.
- (f) For the purposes of this section, “motorcycle” means a self-propelled vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the driver and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, and includes a motor scooter or other similar two-wheeled motor vehicle.

5. By-law No. 197, being “A By-law To Provide for Parking Meters on Roads in the Borough of East York”, of the former Borough of East York, is amended by adding the following clauses to Section 7:

- (d) Despite anything else in this Section 7, up to three motorcycles may be parked in a parking space, provided that no person shall park a motorcycle in a parking space at an angle greater than forty-five (45) degrees to the curb, and Section 4 shall not prevent the driver or operator of a motorcycle parked as required under this Subsection 7(d) from using the unexpired time remaining on the parking meter from its previous use without depositing a coin in the meter.
- (e) No person shall:
  - (i) park a motorcycle in a parking space occupied by an automobile or more than two (2) motorcycles; or
  - (ii) park an automobile in a parking space occupied by a motorcycle.
- (f) For the purposes of this section, “motorcycle” means a self-propelled vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the driver and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, and includes a motor scooter or other similar two-wheeled motor vehicle.

**6.** Chapter 187, Parking Meters, of the Municipal Code of the former City of Etobicoke, is amended by renumbering the first clause in § 187-6 as Subsection A and adding the following Subsections to § 187-6:

- B. Despite anything else in this § 187-6, up to three motorcycles may be parked in a parking space, provided that no person shall park a motorcycle in a parking space at an angle greater than forty-five (45) degrees to the curb, and § 187-3 shall not prevent the driver or operator of a motorcycle parked as required under this Subsection 187-6B from using the unexpired time remaining on the parking meter from its previous use without depositing a coin in the meter.
- C. No person shall:
  - (i) park a motorcycle in a parking space occupied by an automobile or more than two (2) motorcycles; or
  - (ii) park an automobile in a parking space occupied by a motorcycle.
- D. For the purposes of this section, “motorcycle” means a self-propelled vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the driver and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, and includes a motor scooter or other similar two-wheeled motor vehicle.

**7.** By-law No. 1645-89, being “A By-law Respecting Parking Meters”, of the former City of York, is amended by adding the following clauses to Section 7:

- (d) Despite anything else in this Section 7, up to three motorcycles may be parked in a parking space, provided that no person shall park a motorcycle in a parking space at an angle greater than forty-five (45) degrees to the curb, and Section 4 shall not prevent the driver or operator of a motorcycle parked as required under this Subsection 7(d) from using the unexpired time remaining on the parking meter from its previous use without depositing a coin in the meter.
- (e) No person shall:
  - (i) park a motorcycle in a parking space occupied by an automobile or more than two (2) motorcycles; or
  - (ii) park an automobile in a parking space occupied by a motorcycle.

- (f) For the purposes of this section, “motorcycle” means a self-propelled vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the driver and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, and includes a motor scooter or other similar two-wheeled motor vehicle.

8. Chapter 982, Parking - Meter, of the Municipal Code of the former City of York, is amended by adding the following Sections to the Chapter:

- 982.2.8.1 Despite anything else in Sections 982.2.6, 982.2.7 and 982.2.8, up to three motorcycles may be parked in a parking space, provided that no person shall park a motorcycle in a parking space at an angle greater than forty-five (45) degrees to the curb, and Section 982.2.3 shall not prevent the driver or operator of a motorcycle parked as required under this Section from using the unexpired time remaining on the parking meter from its previous use without depositing a coin in the meter.
- 982.2.8.2 No person shall:
- (i) park a motorcycle in a parking space occupied by an automobile or more than two (2) motorcycles; or
  - (ii) park an automobile in a parking space occupied by a motorcycle.
- 982.2.8.3 For the purposes of Sections 982.2.8.1 and 982.2.8.2, “motorcycle” means a self-propelled vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the driver and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, and includes a motor scooter or other similar two-wheeled motor vehicle.
