CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 598-2000

To assume Humber Boulevard between Bloor Street West and Old Mill Road for public highway purposes and to rename that portion of assumed highway “Old Mill Trail”.

WHEREAS notice of a public hearing on July 12, 2000 with respect to the proposed enactment of the draft by-law was advertised in a daily newspaper on June 24 and 27, July 4 and 11, 2000, and interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard, and it is appropriate to assume Humber Boulevard between Bloor Street West and Old Mill Road for public highway purposes and to rename that portion of assumed highway “Old Mill Trail”.

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. The portion of Humber Boulevard between Bloor Street West and Old Mill Road, described by W. Kowalenko, O.L.S., City Surveyor, as follows, namely:

Part of Parcel 1205 in the Register for Section Township of Etobicoke.

Being the Public Highway Humber Boulevard on Plan M-416 registered in the Land Registry Office for the Land Titles Division of Metropolitan Toronto (No. 66).

In the City of Toronto (formerly in the City of Etobicoke) and Province of Ontario is assumed for public highway purposes and renamed Old Mill Trail.
