**CITY OF TORONTO**

**BY-LAW No. 615-2000**

**A By-law to Establish Certain Lands as a Municipal Highway.**

WHEREAS the City of Toronto has acquired certain lands as hereinafter described and the Council of the City deems it appropriate and necessary to accept the said lands as a Public Highway forming part of Martingrove Road, in the City of Toronto; and

WHEREAS pursuant to Subsection 1 (a) of Section 297 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O., 1990, as amended, Chapter M.45 provides that the Council of every municipality may pass by-laws for establishing and laying out highways; and

WHEREAS Subsection 111 of Section 210, of the Municipal Act, R.S.O., 1990, as amended, Chapter M.45 provides that by-laws may be passed by the Councils of local municipalities to provide for the surveying, settling and marking the boundary lines of highways and giving names to them;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. That the lands described as Part of Block D on Registered Plan 5737 as in EB261449, be and the same is hereby established and laid out as a public highway within the City and known as part of Martingrove Road and all by-laws presently in force with respect to highways and streets shall apply to the said highway created under this By-law.
2. That this By-law shall take effect upon its approval by the City of Toronto and upon its registration in the appropriate Land Registry Office.
