CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 725-2000

**To name the private walkways at 19 Rear River Street “Old Primrose Lane”
and “Old Trillium Lane”, respectively.**

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

- 1.** The walkways shown on Attachment No. 1 to this By-law dated January, 2000 are named Old Primrose Lane and Old Trillium Lane, respectively.
- 2.** Inaugural Source Incorporated, its agent or successor shall enter into an agreement with the City to pay the City for the costs of fabrication and installation of the appropriate signage.
- 3.** Inaugural Source Incorporated, its agent or successor shall maintain, at their own risk, the signage installed under section 2 of this by-law.

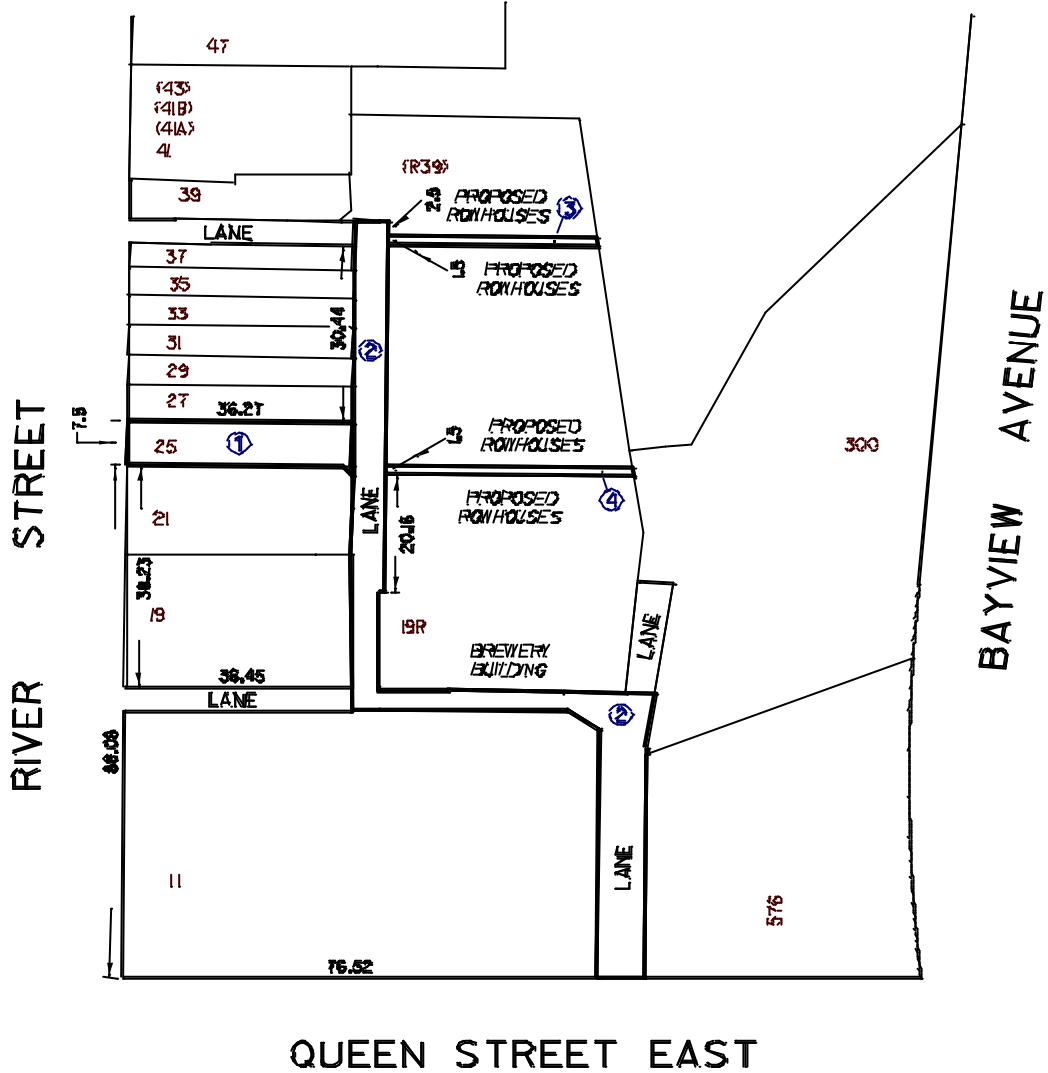
