CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 800-2000

To amend the former Borough of East York By-law No. 1-87, being “A By-law to permit newspaper boxes on untravelled portions of the street”.

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. By-law No. 1-87 of the former Borough of East York, being “A By-law to permit newspaper boxes on untravelled portions of the street”, is amended as follows:
 - A. By deleting the phrase: “an annual fee of Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$7.50)” in Subsection II(2)(a) of By-law No. 1-87 of the former Borough of East York and inserting in lieu thereof the phrase: “an annual fee of Eighteen dollars and fifty cents (\$18.50), such fee to automatically increase on the first day of January in each year by the percentage increase in the All Items Index of the Consumer Price Index (not seasonally adjusted) for the Toronto Census Metropolitan Area, published by Statistics Canada, during the twelve-month period ending on October 1 in the year immediately preceding the rate increase date.”.
 - B. By adding a new Subsection (c) after Subsection (b) in Subsection II(2) of By-law No. 1-87 of the former Borough of East York, as follows:

“(c) an application fee of \$55.00, such fee to automatically increase on the first day of January in each year by the percentage increase in the All Items Index of the Consumer Price Index (not seasonally adjusted) for the Toronto Census Metropolitan Area, published by Statistics Canada, during the twelve-month period ending on October 1 in the year immediately preceding the rate increase date”.
2. This by-law is effective from the date of City Council’s meeting of April 26, 27 and 28, 1999.
