CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 807-2000

To amend the former City of York By-law No. 1812-89, being “A By-law for licensing Non-Residential Boulevard Parking in the City of York”.

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. By-law No. 1812-89 of the former City of York, being “A By-law for licensing Non-Residential Boulevard Parking in the City of York”, is amended as follows:
 - A. By deleting the phrase “of \$50.00 (fifty) dollars has been paid” in Subsection 4(a) of By-law No. 1812-89 of the former City of York and inserting in lieu thereof the following: “of \$250.00 (two-hundred and fifty dollars) has been paid, such fee to automatically increase on the first day of January in each year by the percentage increase in the All Items Index of the Consumer Price Index (not seasonally adjusted) for the Toronto Census Metropolitan Area, published by Statistics Canada, during the twelve-month period ending on October 1 in the year immediately preceding the rate increase date”.
 - B. By deleting Section 10 of the former City of York By-law No. 1812-89 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

“10. The person to whom a licence has been issued as provided by this By-law shall pay in advance an annual fee of Two hundred and twenty dollars (\$220.00) per space or part thereof of boulevard with respect to which the licence was issued, such fee to automatically increase on the first day of January in each year by the percentage increase in the All Items Index of the Consumer Price Index (not seasonally adjusted) for the Toronto Census Metropolitan Area, published by Statistics Canada, during the twelve-month period ending on October 1 in the year immediately preceding the rate increase date. Where the licence is cancelled a refund at the rate of \$18.33 per month for each full calendar month remaining to the licence expiry date, minus the amount of five dollars (\$5.00) administration cost for processing the request, be payable to the licensee upon their written request, return of the Boulevard Parking Licence, and return the area to its original state”.

2. This by-law is effective from the date of City Council's meeting of April 26, 27 and 28, 1999.
