CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 29-2001

To amend City of Toronto Municipal Code Ch. 169, Officials, City, to authorize the City Clerk and City Solicitor to process by-laws to implement Council's decisions that don't have a specific bill authority, have errors in by-law references, or it is necessary to repeal a by-law.

WHEREAS By-law No. 3-1998, "To delineate certain duties and responsibilities of the Clerk for the City of Toronto", as amended, and By-law No. 29-1998, "To appoint and delineate certain duties and responsibilities of the City Solicitor for the City of Toronto", as amended, are codified in Chapter 169, Officials, City, of The City of Toronto Municipal Code;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. Chapter 169, Officials, City, of The City of Toronto Municipal Code, is amended by adding the following:

§ 169-14.1. Authority to process by-laws.

The City Clerk may process by-laws where an action is authorized by Council and if the recommendation to amend a by-law or introduce a bill has been omitted or if there is an error in the reference to the by-law that should be amended or if it is necessary to repeal a by-law.

§ 169-26.1. Authority to process by-laws.

The City Solicitor may process by-laws where an action is authorized by Council and if the recommendation to amend a by-law or introduce a bill has been omitted or if there is an error in the reference to the by-law that should be amended or if it is necessary to repeal a by-law.
