CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 218-2001

To make a technical amendment to Article III of Chapter 363, Building Construction and Demolition, of the City of Toronto Municipal Code.

WHEREAS at its meeting held on October 3, 4, 5, 2000; and its Special Meetings held on October 6, 10, 11 and 12, 2000, Council amended Clause No. 7 of Report No. 9 of the Planning and Transportation Committee by amending the proposed Construction Fence By-law; and

WHEREAS the bill that was introduced to give effect to the proposed by-law and that was subsequently enacted as By-law No. 721-2000 did not, through inadvertence, include the amendment made to the proposed by-law by Council; and

WHEREAS By-law No. 721-2000 was subsequently codified as Article III of Chapter 363, Building Construction and Demolition, of the City of Toronto Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS it is necessary to amend Article III of Chapter 363 to reflect the amendment made to the proposed by-law by Council.

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

- 1. Article III, Fencing of Construction and Demolition Sites, of Chapter 363, Building Construction and Demolition, of the City of Toronto Municipal Code is amended by adding the words "and be free of graffiti and posters" to the end of § 363-15F(1) so that it now reads:
 - "(1) In good repair with no gaps larger than 100 millimetres below the fencing and be free of graffiti and posters";
