BY-LAW No. 490-2001

To stop up and close a portion of Crawford Street, south of King Street West to Canniff Street.

WHEREAS it is recommended that a portion of the public highway Crawford Street, south of King Street West to Canniff Street, be stopped up and closed as a public highway; and

WHEREAS notice of the proposed by-law to stop up and close the said portion of Crawford Street was published in a daily newspaper on April 23, 30, May 7 and 14, 2001 and no one who claimed that the person's land would be prejudicially affected by the said by-law applied to be heard;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. The portion of Crawford Street, south of King Street West to Canniff Street, described as follows:

Part of PIN 21299-0043 (LT)

Being part of Crawford Street dedicated by By-law No. 213-90 (Instrument C649787), being part of the Plan of the Ordnance Reserve filed in the Land Registry Office for the Metropolitan Toronto Registry Division (No. 64), designated as PART 1 on Plan 66R-18977 deposited in the Land Registry Office for the Land Titles Division of Metropolitan Toronto (No. 66), in the City of Toronto and Province of Ontario

is hereby stopped up and closed as a public highway.
