BY-LAW No. 617-2001

To effect interim control on certain lands adjacent to the north side of the CN Lakeshore Rail Corridor.

WHEREAS Council, at its meeting of July 24, 25 and 26, 2001 adopted by way of motion the Report of the Commissioner of Urban Development Services recommending that an interim control by-law be passed in respect of certain lands adjacent to the north side of the CN Lakeshore Rail Corridor within the City of Toronto, which lands are the subject of a review or study of land use planning policies; and

WHEREAS Section 38 of the *Planning Act* permits the council of a municipality to pass an interim control by-law where the Council has directed that a review or study be undertaken in respect of land use planning policies within the municipality or in any defined area or areas thereof;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

- 1. No person shall use any land, building or structure or use any addition to any building or structure for any purpose on the lands shown within the heavy lines on the attached Maps 1 to 3, inclusive.
- 2. This By-law shall be in effect for a period of one year from the 25th day of July, 2001.
