**CITY OF TORONTO**

**BY-LAW No. 9-2002**

**To layout and dedicate certain land for public highway purposes to form part of the  
public highway Chelway Road.**

WHEREAS the City has acquired certain lands as hereinafter described and the Council of the City deems it appropriate and necessary to accept the said lands as Public Highway; and

WHEREAS subsection 1(a) of Section 297, of the *Municipal Act*, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M.45 provides that the Council of every municipality may pass by-laws for establishing and laying out highways; and

WHEREAS subsection 111 of Section 210, of the *Municipal Act*, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M.45 provides that by-laws may be passed by the Councils of local municipalities to provide for surveying, settling and marking the boundary lines of highways and giving names to them;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. The lands described as Parts of Lots 651, 652 and 653 on Plan 1095, designated as Part 3 on Plan 66R-18495, in the City of Toronto (formerly City of Scarborough), more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached hereto, which forms part of this By-law, are hereby established and laid out as a public highway within the City to be known as Chelway Road.
2. All By-laws presently in force with respect to highways and streets shall apply to the said highways created under this By-law.
