BY-LAW No. 198-2002

To authorize the sale of the closed portion of Pitt Avenue, south of Donside Drive.

WHEREAS it is recommended that the closed portion of Pitt Avenue, south of Donside Drive, be sold on the terms and conditions set out in Clause No. 6 of Scarborough Community Council Report No. 11, as adopted by Council at its meeting held on December 4, 5 and 6, 2001; and

WHEREAS notice of the proposed by-law to authorize the sale of the said closed highway was published in the Toronto Sun on February 1, 8, 15 and 22, 2002 and no one who claimed that the person's land would be prejudicially affected by the said by-law applied to be heard;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. The soil and freehold of the closed portion of Pitt Avenue, south of Donside Drive, described as follows:

PIN 06002-0056 (LT)

Part of Pitt Avenue, formerly Eastbourne Avenue, on Plan 1859, closed by City of Scarborough By-law No. 22770 (TB643508), designated as Part 1 on Plan 64R-12199 in the Land Titles Division of the Toronto Registry Office (No. 66) in the City of Toronto (formerly the City of Scarborough) and Province of Ontario shall be sold on the terms and conditions set out in Clause No. 6 of Scarborough Community Council Report No. 11, as adopted by Council at its meeting held on December 4, 5 and 6, 2001.
