BY-LAW No. 245-2002

To stop up and close portions of the public highway Barberry Place and to authorize the sale thereof.

WHEREAS it is recommended that portions of the public highway Barberry Place be stopped up and closed as a public highway and be sold on the terms and conditions set out in Clause No. 1 of North York Community Council Report No. 1, as adopted by Council at its meeting held on February 13, 14 and 15, 2002; and

WHEREAS notice of the proposed by-law to stop up and close the said portions of highway and to authorize the sale thereof was published in the Toronto Sun on March 12, 19, 26 and April 2, 2002 and no one who claimed that the person's land would be prejudicially affected by the said by-law applied to be heard;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. The portions of the public highway Barberry Place, described as follows:

PIN 10090-0314 (R)

Part of the Public Highway Barberry Place on Plan 4797, designated as Parts 5 and 11 on Plan 64R-16980 in the Registry Division of the Toronto Registry Office (No. 66) in the City of Toronto (formerly City of North York) and Province of Ontario are hereby stopped up and closed as a public highway.

2. The soil and freehold of the portions of the public highway stopped up and closed by Section 1 of this By-law shall be sold on the terms and conditions set out in Clause No. 1 of North York Community Council Report No. 1, as adopted by Council at its meeting held on February 13, 14 and 15, 2002.
