## BY-LAW No. 746-2002

## To amend the Etobicoke Zoning Code with respect to the Princess Anne Manor Area.

WHEREAS authority is given to Council by Section 34 of the *Planning Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c.P. 13, as amended, to pass this By-law; and whereas Council of the City of Toronto has provided adequate information to the public and has held at least one public meeting in accordance with the *Planning Act*;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

- 1. Notwithstanding Section 320-55 of the Zoning Code, the following provisions shall apply to one-family detached dwellings located on those lands identified as R1 within the dark lines in Schedule 'A' attached hereto:
  - (a) Lot Frontage. No one-family detached dwelling shall be hereafter built upon any lot except in accordance with the following regulations for minimum lot frontage:
    - (i) Minimum, where piped water and sanitary sewers exist or will be made available by the city: 24.3 metres.
- 2. Notwithstanding the minimum lot frontage set out above, any lot on the lands shown within the dark lines on Schedule 'A' having a lot frontage of less than 24.3 metres as of the date of the passing of this by-law, shall be deemed to comply with the minimum lot frontage of 24.3 metres.
- **3.** Where the provisions of Sections 1 and 2, herein conflict with the Zoning Code, the provisions of Sections 1 and 2 shall take precedence, otherwise the Zoning Code shall continue to apply.

4. Chapter 324, Site Specific, of the Zoning Code is hereby amended to include reference to this by-law by adding the following to Section 324-1, Table of Site Specific By-laws:
