CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 294-2004

To layout and dedicate certain land at the north east corner of Lake Shore Boulevard East and Cherry Street for public highway purposes to form part of the public highway Lake Shore Boulevard East.

WHEREAS the City is the owner of certain land laid out and expropriated for public highway purposes by former Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto By-law Nos. 1369 and 1467 respectively; and

WHEREAS the owner of the adjoining property has requested that access to Lake Shore Boulevard East via the existing driveway be legalized;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. Certain land described by W. Kowalenko, O.L.S., City Surveyor, as follows, namely:

PIN 21385-0138 (LT).

Part of Marsh Lands patented to the City of Toronto by Ontario Government on May 18, 1880 and Dominion Government on October 10, 1903, Geographic Township of York, designated as PART 1 on Plan 63R-625 in the Land Titles Division of the Toronto Registry Office (No. 66) in the City of Toronto and Province of Ontario is laid out and dedicated for public highway purposes to form part of the public highway Lake Shore Boulevard East.
