CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 964-2004

To name the private lanes on the west side of Staines Road, north and south of Seasons Drive as “Cricket Mews” and “Culver Lane”.

WHEREAS notice of the proposed enactment of the draft by-law was posted on the City of Toronto web site from October 5 to October 11, 2004, and interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard at a public meeting held on October 12, 2004, and it is appropriate to name the private lanes on the west side of Staines Road, north and south of Seasons Drive, as “Cricket Mews” and “Culver Lane”;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. The private lanes shown on Attachment No. 1 to this By-law dated May 27, 2004 are named “Cricket Mews” and “Culver Lane”.
2. Rangemanner Estates, its agent or successor shall enter into an agreement with the City to pay the City for the costs of fabrication and installation of the appropriate signage.
3. Rangemanner Estates, its agent or successor shall maintain, at their own risk, the signage installed under section 2 of this By-law.

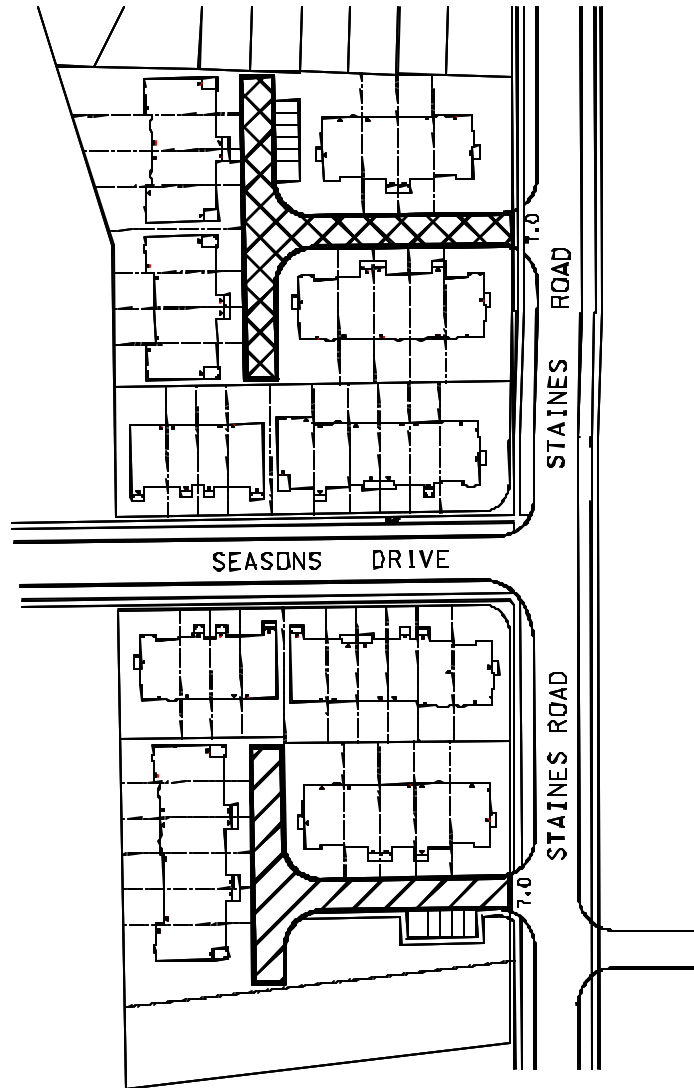
