CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW No. 1223-2012

To repeal former City of Toronto By-law No. 1997-0219 being a by-law to designate the property at 102 - 108 Shuter Street as being of cultural heritage value or interest.

WHEREAS by the adoption of Clause 11, Report 7 of the Neighbourhoods Committee at its meeting held on May 12, 1997, Council of the former City of Toronto passed By-law No. 1997-0219 being a by-law to designate the property at 102 - 108 Shuter Street as being of cultural heritage value or interest under the *Ontario Heritage Act*; and

WHEREAS the building at 102 Shuter Street was demolished in 2007 by order of the Chief Building Official and the property now stands vacant;

The Council of the City of Toronto HEREBY ENACTS as follows:

1. By-law No. 1997-0219, being a by-law to designate the property at 102 - 108 Shuter Street as being of cultural heritage value or interest is repealed.
2. The City Solicitor is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered in the proper Land Registry Office against the property described in By-law No. 1997-0219 and as set out in Schedule "A" to this by-law.
3. The City Clerk is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owners of the property at 102 - 108 Shuter Street and upon the Ontario Heritage Trust; to cause notice of this by-law to be posted on the City's web site for a period of 30 days in accordance with Municipal Code Chapter 162, Notice, Public, Article II, § 162-4, Notice requirements under the *Ontario Heritage Act* and to delete reference to the property from the City's heritage property register.
