CITY OF TORONTO

BY-LAW 588-2017

To amend the Fair Wage Schedule of City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 67, Fair Wage, to increase the wage rates in Schedule C to Chapter 67 for the 2016–2019 period with respect to the General Classifications, Heavy Construction Work, Industrial, Commercial and Institutional Work, Road Building Work, Sewer and Water Main Construction, Utility Work classifications and to add or delete certain occupations included in those classifications.

Whereas Council delegated authority to the Manager, Fair Wage Office, to update and increase the wage rates for the General Classifications, Heavy Construction Work, Industrial, Commercial and Institutional Work, Road Building Work, Sewer and Water Main Construction, Utility Work classifications and to add or delete certain occupations included in those classifications in Schedule C to Municipal Code Chapter 67, Fair Wage, from time to time, which increased wage rates are set out in Appendix I attached to this by-law; and

Whereas Council authorized the City Solicitor to introduce to Council any bills necessary to amend Municipal Code Chapter 67, Fair Wage to implement Council's decision with respect to the delegation of authority to the Manager, Fair Wage Office; and

Whereas the increased wage rates were to have gone into effect June 1, 2016, however due to outstanding ratification of various labour trade agreements upon which the wage rate increases are based, the rates are only now available for incorporation into the by-law; and

Whereas the increased wage rates for 2016–2019 shall be in effect from August 1, 2017 to May 31, 2019 or until further amended;

The Council of the City of Toronto enacts:

Municipal Code Chapter 67, Fair Wage, is amended as follows:

- 1. The 2013-2016 wage rates in the Fair Wage Schedule for the classifications in Schedule C to Chapter 67, under the headings "General Classifications", "Heavy Construction Work", "Industrial, Commercial and Institutional Work", "Road Building Work", "Sewer and Water Main Construction" and "Utility Work" are deleted and replaced by the fair wage rates in Schedule C for the classifications "General Classifications, 2016-2019", "Heavy Construction Work, 2016-2019", "Industrial, Commercial and Institutional Work, 2016-2019", "Road Building Work, 2016-2019", "Sewer and Water Main Construction, 2016-2019" and "Utility Work, 2016-2019" attached to this by-law as Appendix I, to go into effect August 1, 2017 for any new Tenders, Requests for Quotations, Requests for Proposals, Purchase Orders, and Divisional Purchase Orders issued by the City after the date of enactment of this by-law.
- 2. This by-law shall be in force upon enactment. The increased wage rates shall be in effect from August 1, 2017 to May 31, 2019, or until further amended.

- 3. Despite sections 1 and 2 of this by-law, the 2013-2016 wage rates for the General Classifications, Heavy Construction Work, Industrial, Commercial and Institutional Work, Road Building Work, Sewer and Water Main Construction and Utility Work classifications of Schedule C to Municipal Code Chapter 67, Fair Wage, shall remain in full force and effect:
 - (1) For any procurement call issued by the City of Toronto and for any contract entered into between any contractor and the City of Toronto prior to the date of enactment of this by-law for the term (including any renewals) of the contract.
 - (2) For the purposes of any review, actions, claims, proceedings, etc. until that contract term, review, action, claim, proceeding, etc. has been concluded to the full extent permitted by law.
 - (3) Sections 1 and 2 of this by-law shall not affect any offence committed against, any penalty incurred in respect to, nor any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy under the provisions of this chapter prior to this by-law coming into effect.
 - (4) Any investigation or legal proceeding commenced under or in respect to the provisions of this chapter prior to this by-law coming into effect shall be taken up and continued in conformity with the provisions of this chapter in effect at such time.
- 4. For greater certainty, for any procurement call issued after the date of enactment of this by-law and prior to August 1, 2017, the 2013-2016 fair wage rates for all Schedule C classifications will apply to any work performed prior to August 1, 2017. The 2016-2019 fair wage rates for all Schedule C classifications will apply to any work performed from August 1, 2017 to the end of the contract (including any renewals).

All working forepersons will receive a minimum of ninety cents (\$0.90) per hour above the trade rate of the majority of the employees in the group supervised.

If an employee works more than fifty percent (50%) of their shift on a higher rated job than their regular classification, they will be paid the higher rate for the whole shift.

HOURS OF WORK AND OVERTIME:

- (A) The regular working day shall be nine (9) hours/day and subject to variation by mutual consent of the parties, shall be between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., from Monday to Friday inclusive.
- (B) The standard hours of work for all employees other than watchpersons, shall be forty-five (45) hours/week, exclusive of travelling time to and from the job.
- (C) All work performed in excess of the regular working day of nine (9) hours from Monday to Friday, inclusive, shall be deemed overtime work. The rate of wage shall be time and one-half (1 ½) the regular day shift rate.

City of Toronto By-law 588-2017

(D) All work on Saturday shall be paid for at double (2) the regular day shift rate. On a three shift operation, the 15th shift may be worked at straight time on Saturday until 7:00 a.m. and the applicable shift premium shall be paid.

NOTE:

Overtime at the rate of double (2) the employees' current hourly rate shall be paid to all employees, other than watchperson for all work performed on Sundays and the following Statutory Holidays:

New Year's Day, Family Day, Good Friday, Victoria Day, Canada Day, Civic Holiday, Labour Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day.

- * FRINGE BENEFITS: "Fringe Benefits" shall include such benefits as company pension plans, apprenticeship training, extended health care benefits, dental and prescription drugs, etc. It does **NOT** include payroll burden deductions such as C.P.P., E.H.T., W.S.I.B., E.I.C., etc.
- * **VACATION AND HOLIDAY PAY:** 10 percent of the hourly rate.

For contractors that do not offer "fringe benefits" to their workers, the fringe benefits hourly rate shall be added to the hourly or weekly rate as shown above.

It is understood that if there is inclement weather during the week, that Friday will be a ten-hour day, if required.
- (B) Overtime at the rate of time and one-half the employee's current hourly rate shall be paid to all employees, except watchperson and float drivers, for all work performed on Saturdays. Operating Engineers double time for Saturdays, Sundays and Statutory Holidays.
- (C) Overtime at the rate of double the employee's current hourly rate shall be paid for all employees except watchperson, for all work performed on Sundays or the Statutory Holidays listed namely (Labourers and Teamsters): New Year's Day, Family Day, Good Friday, Victoria Day, Canada Day, Civic Holiday, Labour Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(D) Watchpersons shall receive overtime payment at the rate of time and one-half the employee's current hourly pay rate for all work performed on such employee's seventh consecutive shift.

- (A) For air pressure over twenty-one pounds (21 lbs.), the employer agrees to pay two dollars (\$2.00) per pound compressed air premium for each pound over twenty-one pounds (21 lbs.), in addition to the twenty-one pound (21 lb.) rate.
- (B) Where employees are required to work in compressed air, they shall receive a minimum of nine (9) hours/day or shift; it being understood and agreed that the ninth (9th) hour shall be paid at straight time rates.
- (C) It is understood and agreed that air pressure premium will be paid/shift regardless of the time spent by an employee in compressed air, save and except when an employee voluntarily leaves the air. Rest periods as required by law when working under air pressure are to be paid, and no deduction will be made for a meal break falling in the rest period between the two working periods.

(D) HOT BEVERAGES

- (i) The employer shall, at his own expense, supply sugar and hot beverages for employees working in compressed air during rest periods.
- (ii) Containers and cups for the beverages required as outlined above, shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition and kept stored in a closed container.
