BY-LAW 325-2018

To repeal City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 387, Carbon Monoxide Detectors.

Whereas at its meeting of March 6, 1998, City Council adopted By-law 60-1998, which by-law enacted the Carbon Monoxide Detector By-law, or Chapter 387, Carbon Monoxide Detectors, of the City of Toronto Municipal Code, under the authority of Section 31 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.13, as amended, prescribing maintenance and occupancy standards for dwelling units with respect to carbon monoxide; and

Whereas under sections 7 and 8 of the City of Toronto Act, 2006, the City may pass by-laws in respect of the health, safety and well-being of persons and the economic, social and environmental well-being of the City; and

Whereas due to amendments to both Ontario Regulation 213/07, commonly known as the Ontario Fire Code and the Fire Protection and Prevention Act, 1997, the provisions of Chapter 387, Carbon Monoxide Detectors, no longer provide a significant benefit to the health, safety and well-being of persons and the economic, social and environmental well-being of the City, Council has determined it is appropriate to repeal Municipal Code Chapter 387;

The Council of the City of Toronto enacts:

1. Chapter 387, Carbon Monoxide Detectors, of the City of Toronto Municipal Code is repealed.
