BY-LAW 10-2019

To repeal By-law 273-2014 being a by-law to designate the properties at 68 and 70 Shuter Street (Edward Cooper Houses) as being of cultural heritage value or interest.

Whereas City Council passed By-law 273-2014 to designate the properties at 68 and 70 Shuter Street (Edward Cooper Houses) as being of cultural heritage value or interest; and

Whereas the owner subsequently applied to Council to permit the demolition of the Edward Cooper Houses located at 68 and 70 Shuter Street; and

Whereas Council approved the application to demolish subject to certain terms and conditions; and

Whereas the Edward Cooper Houses have been demolished; and

Whereas under subsection 34.3(1)(a) of the Ontario Heritage Act, where Council consents to an application to demolish, the council of the municipality shall pass a by-law repealing the designation by-law and shall delete reference to the by-law from the heritage register;

The Council of the City of Toronto enacts:

- 1. By-law 273-2014 being a by-law to designate the property at 68 and 70 Shuter Street, more particularly described in Schedule A attached to this by-law, is repealed.
- 2. The City Solicitor is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule A to this by-law in the proper Land Registry Office.
- **3.** The City Clerk is authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owners of the property at 68 and 70 Shuter Street and upon the Ontario Heritage Trust; to cause notice of this by-law to be posted on the City's web site for a period of 30 days in accordance with Municipal Code Chapter 162, Notice, Public, Article II, § 162-4.1. Notice requirements under the Ontario Heritage Act, and to delete reference to the property from the City's heritage property register.
