Subject: 2007 Access Equity and Human Rights (AEHR) – Community Partnership and Investment Program (CPIP)

Recommendation:

The Community Partnership and Investment Program Appeals Sub-Committee recommends to the Community Development and Recreation Committee that City Council adopt the following staff recommendations in the Recommendations Section of the report (April 30, 2007) from the City Manager:

- 1. City Council approve allocations of \$768.8 thousand for the 2007 Access Equity and Human Rights (AEHR) – Community Partnership and Investment Program (CPIP) as outlined in Appendix 1; and**
- 2. the sum of \$5 thousand be set aside for appeals to the 2007 Access Equity and Human Rights (AEHR) – Community Partnership and Investment Program (CPIP), subject to the submission of a report recommending the allocation of this reserve.**

Decision Advice and Other Information:

The Community Partnership and Investment Program Appeals Sub-Committee:

1. referred the appeals from the following organizations to the City Manager for further review and report to the meeting of the Community Development and Recreation Committee to be held on June 5, 2007:

2. referred the late application from the Canadian Council of Christian and Jews – Organization 12 to the City Manager, with a request that the organization be considered by staff providing it meets the AEHR criteria.

Background:

The Community Partnership and Investment Program Appeals Sub-Committee on May 15, 2007, considered a report (April 30, 2007) from the City Manager recommending allocations for the 2007 Access Equity and Human Rights (AEHR) - Community Partnership and Investment Program (CPIP); and noting that of the 89 applications received in 2007, 75 are recommended for funding.

Recommendations:

The City Manager recommends that:

3. the Community Partnership and Investment Appeals Sub-Committee forward this report to the Community Development and Recreation Committee.
