Part-Time and After Hours Child Care

(September 24, 2007) Report from General Manager, Children's Services

Decision Advice and Other Information

The Community Development and Recreation Committee requested the General Manager, Children's Services, to:

- 1. as part of the service planning process for the 2010-2014 Child Care Service Plan, hold consultations with stakeholders, including parents, to determine the demand for part-time and after hours child care and opportunities to provide it; and
- 2. report to the January 2008 meeting of the Community Development and Recreation Committee on the feasibility and costs of implementing a small pilot project to model part-time care options and test various fee and cost scenarios.

Financial Impact

This report will have no financial impact beyond what has already been approved in the current year's budget.

Summary

This report examines commitments made regarding part-time and after hours child care in the current 2005-2009 Child Care Services Plan. It looks at ways in which Toronto currently supports part-time and after hours child care including initiatives the City has undertaken to

encourage it. The report concludes that it is not particularly timely to consider new policies and incentives to increase the availability of part-time and after hours child care. It recommends that Children's Services hold consultations with stakeholders, including parents, to determine the demand for part-time and after hours child care and opportunities to provide it, as part of the service planning process for the 2010-2014 Child Care Service Plan.
