Glenholme Avenue-Amendments to Parking Regulations

SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to obtain approval to amend the existing parking regulations on Glenholme Avenue, between Holland Park Avenue and Rogers Road.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Transportation Services recommend that:

- 1. The existing no parking prohibition at all times on the east side of Glenholme Avenue, from a point 147 metres north of Earnscliffe Road and Rogers Road, be rescinded;
- 2. Parking be prohibited at all times on the east side of Glenholme Avenue, from a point 147 metres north of Earnscliffe Road and Holland Park Avenue;
- 3. Permit parking be allowed from 12:01 a.m. to 6:00 a.m., daily, on the east side of Glenholme Avenue between Holland Park Avenue and Rogers Road; and enacting all appropriate bills.

ISSUE BACKGROUND

Councillor Cesar Palacio, on behalf of an area resident, requested Transportation Services staff to review the feasibility of rescinding the parking prohibition on the east side of Glenholme Avenue, between Holland Park Avenue and Rogers Road and implement a permit parking regulation on the above mentioned section of Glenholme Avenue.

COMMENTS

Glenholme Avenue, between Holland Park Avenue and Rogers Road is a local street operating one-way northbound with a posted speed limit of 30 km/h and a road width of 8.5 metres.

Parking is prohibited at all times on the east side of Glenholme Avenue, between Holland Park Avenue and Rogers Road. Permit parking is in effect from 12:01 a.m. to 6:00 a.m., daily on the west side of Glenholme Avenue, between Holland Park Avenue and Rogers Road. Parking is otherwise allowed for a maximum period of three hours at other times.

As indicated above, this section of the street is one-way northbound with an 8.5 metre width. As a result, it can accommodate two sided parking for motorists with a parking permit, and visitors at all other times.

Given the width of the street in a one-way direction on Glenholme Avenue, between Holland Park Avenue and Rogers Road, rescinding the existing parking prohibition and the implementing permit parking on the east side of the street will increase the number of parking spaces available for area residents and visitors.
