**TRAINEES SHALL BE EMPLOYED AT A PERCENTAGE OF THE APPLICABLE JOURNEYMAN RATE AS FOLLOWS; -AND BE REGISTERED IN A BONAFIDE APPRENTICESHIP/TRAINING PROGRAM RECOGNIZED BY THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO

First 1500 hours = 75% Second 1500 hours = 90%

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*FRINGE BENEFITS: "Fringe Benefits" shall include such benefits as company pension plans, apprenticeship training, extended health care benefits, dental and prescription drugs, etc. It does NOT include payroll burden deductions such as C.P.P., E.H.T., W.S.I.B., E.I.C., etc.

*HOURS OF WORK AND OVERTIME:

The regular hours of work shall be nine (9) hours per day, Monday to Friday inclusive. All time worked after nine (9) hours per day or six o'clock in the afternoon (6:00 p.m.) any day or after forty-five (45) hours per week, shall be deemed overtime work, shift work and shall be paid at time and one-half (1/2X) the regular day shift rate, save and except shift work.

* VACATION AND HOLIDAY PAY: 10% of the hourly rate.

FOR CONTRACTORS THAT DO NOT OFFER "FRINGE BENEFITS" TO THEIR WORKERS, THE FRINGE BENEFITS HOURLY RATE SHALL BE ADDED TO THE HOURLY OR WEEKLY RATE AS SHOWN ABOVE.

All City procurement documents and awarded contracts issued prior to any revised Fair Wage Schedules coming into force will continue to be in accordance with the Fair Wage Schedules as of the date tendered and will continue for the duration of the contract.
