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Sexual Health in Toronto 2007

(September 28, 2007) Report from Medical Officer of Health

Decision Advice and Other Information

The Board of Health:

1. requested the Medical Officer of Health to collaborate with the Ministry of Education, the Faculties of Education and the Ontario College of Teachers to ensure that delivery of comprehensive sexual health education is included in new teachers' curriculum;

2. encouraged Boards of Education and teachers' federations to request their grades 4 to 8 teachers to attend Sexual Health Promotion Training, including Board of Education Professional Development Training Days;
3. requested the Chair of the Board of Health and Medical Officer of Health to meet with the Minister of Health and Long-Term Care and the Minister of Education to present statistics and concerns raised by this report and recommend that a joint working group be established to develop enhanced curricula and other programs targeted at children and young people; and
4. requested the Medical Officer of Health to give a presentation to a future meeting of the Board of Health on harm reduction.

Summary

This report provides current epidemiological data on sexually transmitted infection rates (STIs), and sexual behaviour in Toronto and a program update on Toronto Public Health (TPH) sexual health programs and services subsequent to the 2004 Board of Health report Strategies to Address the Increase in Sexually Transmitted Infections in Toronto.

In Toronto, STIs accounted for 66% of all reported diseases. Identification, treatment, follow-up and prevention of STIs is a substantial component of the work of TPH. Current data show an increase in reports of chlamydia, gonorrhea, HIV and late latent syphilis. In part, this increase can be attributed to more sensitive tests and an increase in testing. Despite high STI rates, Toronto has the second lowest chlamydia and gonorrhea rates and the lowest infectious syphilis rates when compared to Canada's other large urban areas.

Research shows that age at first intercourse has not changed in recent years. However, there is a slight increase in the number of people reporting multiple sexual partners. Condoms and birth control pills are the two most common forms of contraception for people under 25 years of age. The rate of consistent condom use among youth remains around 40%. Teen pregnancies and abortion rates have been decreasing steadily for many years.

TPH's Sexual Health Programs include sexual health clinics, STI case management, sexual health promotion, The Works Needle Exchange, The AIDS and Sexual Health Info Line, condom distribution, AIDS Prevention Community Investment Program and purchase of service agreements. While the Sexual Health Programs have received enhancements since 2004, demand for services often exceeds capacity.

TPH's sexual health programs use a variety of innovative tools and strategies to identify needs and trends and to plan and implement responsive and effective programs and services. Toronto Public Health will continue to monitor current epidemiological evidence and social research to ensure that TPH's Sexual Health Programs address the evolving needs of the community.

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Toronto Public Health Plan for an Influenza Pandemic

(September 28, 2007) Report from Medical Officer of Health

Decision Advice and Other Information

The Board of Health requested the Medical Officer of Health to report to a future meeting of the Board of Health on:

1. the costs-to-date associated with Toronto Public Health's Influenza Pandemic Planning activities; and
2. current and projected costs of supplies and equipment.

Summary

This report presents the Toronto Public Health Plan for an Influenza Pandemic (TPHIP). A copy of the plan is on file in the office of the City Clerk and is also available online at <http://www.toronto.ca/health/pandemicflu>. This plan replaces the Toronto Pandemic Influenza Plan which was published in 2005. The new plan describes how Toronto Public Health (TPH) is preparing for an influenza pandemic and provides new information on how response activities such as influenza assessment, treatment and referral centres (community flu centres) and mass vaccination clinics would operate during the pandemic period. The report also identifies outstanding issues which require policy decisions or clarification from other orders of government, including the prophylactic use of antiviral medications and several legal and financial issues related to the operation of community flu centres. The next steps listed in the plan have been integrated into a workplan for TPH staff. That workplan is included in this report as Attachment 1.
