SUMMARY

To obtain approval to install an on-street disabled persons' parking space adjacent to 43 Deloraine Avenue.

The introduction of the disabled persons' parking space will address the distinct needs of the residents of 43 Deloraine Avenue while only reducing the available on-street parking by one space.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Transportation Services, North York District recommends that:

- 1. An on-street parking space for persons with disabilities be established on the south side of Deloraine Avenue, between a point 156 metres west of the westerly limit of Yonge Street and a point 5.5 metres further west thereof; and
- 2. The appropriate City officials be authorized and directed to take any action necessary to give effect to the foregoing, including the introduction in Council of any Bills that may be required.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

All costs associated with the installation of the on-street disabled person's parking space at 43 Deloraine Avenue are included within the Transportation Services Division, North York District's 2007 Operating Budget estimates.

ISSUE BACKGROUND

The Transportation Services Division, North York District, received a request from the residents of 43 Deloraine Avenue, to investigate the feasibility of installing an on-street disabled persons' parking space adjacent to their property for their disabled son.

COMMENTS

Currently, parking is prohibited at anytime on the north side of Deloraine Avenue, between Yonge Street and Jedburgh Road. On the south side of Deloraine Avenue, parking is permitted for periods of up to a maximum of 60 minutes from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday to Saturday, between Jedburgh Road and a point just west of Yonge Street.

The applicant is a holder of a valid disabled persons' parking permit issued by the Ministry of Transportation of Ontario. The creation of this designated parking space will not result in the deprivation of more than one on-street parking space.

Councillor Karen Stintz has indicated her support of the introduction of the on-street disabled persons' parking space.
