SOUTH OF AVONDALE AVENUE AND THE WHOLE OF OAKBURN PLACE
IN THE NORTH YORK COMMUNITY COUNCIL AREA**

NORTH YORK COMMUNITY COUNCIL AREA

The Council of the City of Toronto proposes to pass by-laws to permanently close a portion of Oakburn Crescent, south of Avondale Avenue and the whole of Oakburn Place in the City of Toronto (formerly City of North York).

The roadways to be closed will be incorporated into a redevelopment site. Through the subdivision process, replacement highways will be conveyed to the City to provide access to a proposed development, and connectivity in the transportation network. The roadways to be closed were deemed surplus by City Council at its meeting of June 19, 20 and 22, 2007.

At its meeting to be held in the **Council Chamber at the North York Civic Centre, Lower Level on Monday, September 10, 2007 at 9:45 a.m., the North York Community Council** will hear in person or by his or her counsel, agent or solicitor, any person who wishes to speak to the matter of the **proposed North York Community Council Area by-laws**.
