#### **Decision Advice and Other Information**

The Parks and the Environment Committee:

- 1. referred the following motions to Environment Office staff to be dealt with during the development of a Strategic Plan on Climate Change:
  - a. That the Deputy City Manager be requested to report to the Parks and Environment Committee and Executive Committee on different levels of parking fee charges for downtown parking lots depending on the number of occupants in vehicles;
  - b. That the Chief Planner be requested to report to City Council on creating different development charges and fees dependent on green building construction;
  - c. That the General Manager, Transportation Services, report to Parks and the Environment Committee on the percentage of bike lanes in the four community council areas;
  - d. That the General Manager, Fleet Services, report on the percentage of City vehicles that use diesel fuel and what it would require to have more environmentally friendly vehicles in five years; and
  - e. That the Executive Director, Environment Office, report on the possibility of having a vehicle tax rate related to vehicle size and fuel consumption so that more environmentally friendly vehicles would be identified and pay less tax than others; and

### 2. requested that:

- a. suggestions from the presenters at the Parks and Environment Committee meeting of February 20, 2007 be inventoried and evaluated for effectiveness as possible options for inclusion in the Climate Change Action Plan;
- b. the City's Climate Change Action Plan include baseline, targets and timelines; consider sectors and options for action; and that in developing the plan, financing options be explored, as well as economic development for green jobs and technologies;
- c. Mayor Miller meet with the GTA Mayors and Reeves to discuss common issues and common approaches to climate change;
- d. regulatory abilities and impediments be considered within the framework of the plan;
- e. written materials from the presentation be part of the record and available to Councillors;
- f. Committee Members volunteer to assist in neighbourhood discussions on the Climate Change Action Plan and Clean Air Action Plan;

- g. that the Mayor and staff be requested to explore the possibility of an interregional approach with our sister municipalities to review a co-operative approach on climate change and related issues, and report back to the Parks and Environment Committee as soon as possible to establish a co-operative working group to explore issues, such as smog prevention, clean river systems and ecological approach and green space retention;
- h. that Environment Office staff be requested to prepare a report to include an inventory of ideas presented and discussed at the February 20, 2007 meeting of the Parks and Environment Committee and report to the March 26, 2007 meeting of the Executive Committee to assist in the development of a Toronto climate and clean air plan, and such report also include a preliminary analysis of a neighbourhood climate plan; and
- 3. that the requests of the Mayor be made now and that proposed plans made as a result of the remaining requests be reported to Parks and the Environment Committee before the Climate Change Action Plan is recommended to Council.
