SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter for which Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

The purpose of this report is to obtain approval to reduce the speed limit on a section of Comay Road from 50 km/h to 40 km/h.

As the 40 km/h Speed Limit Warrant requirements are achieved, a 40 km/h speed limit is recommended on Comay Road. This speed limit will be posted from the southerly limit of Gulliver Road to the westerly terminus of Comay Road.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Transportation Services recommends that the Etobicoke York Community Council approve:

- 1. Rescinding the existing 40 km/h speed limit on Comay Road from the southerly limit of Gulliver Road and a point 390 metres south and west of Gulliver Road and the existing 50 km/h speed limit from a point 390 metres south and west of Gulliver Road to the westerly terminus of Comay Road.
- 2. Introducing a 40 km/h speed limit on Comay Road, between the northerly limit of Comay Road and the westerly terminus of Comay Road, as the requirements of the 40 km/h Speed Limit Warrant are achieved.

ISSUE BACKGROUND

Councillor Frank Di Giorgio, on behalf of area residents, requested Transportation Services staff to review the feasibility of reducing the existing speed limit on a section of Comay Road, designated with a 50 km/h speed limit, to a 40 km/h speed limit.

COMMENTS

Comay Road, between the southerly limit of Gulliver Road and the westerly terminus of Comay Road is a local street operating two-way with an existing 40 km/h speed limit from the southerly limit of Gulliver Road and a point 390 metres south and west of Gulliver Road and an existing 50 km/h speed limit from a point 390 metres south and west of Gulliver Road to the westerly terminus of Comay Road. Comay Road has a road width of 8.5 metres with no sidewalks on either side of the roadway.

A review of the Toronto Police Service collision records indicates that over a three-year period ending December 31, 2007, no collisions were reported on Comay Road related to speeding.

Transportation staff reviewed Comay Road against the technical warrants for introducing a 40 km/h speed limit on the remaining section of Comay Road that has a designated 50 km/h zone. The justification for the introduction of a 40 km/h speed limit is based on a technical warrant adopted by Council for use in the City of Toronto. Application of the required data to this warrant revealed that a 40 km/h speed limit is warranted on this section of Comay Road. The warrant is met because the Pedestrian Environment criteria are satisfied. Specifically, the road width is less than 10.5 metres, and there is an absence of sidewalks on both sides of the roadway.

Since this section of Comay Road meets the Council approved warrants for a 40 km/h speed limit from a point 390 metres south and west of Gulliver Road to the westerly terminus of Comay Road, it is recommended that the speed limit be reduced from 50 km/h to 40 km/h.
