Summary

This application was made on or after January 1, 2007 and is subject to the new provisions of the Planning Act and the City of Toronto Act, 2006.

This application proposes a rezoning to bring the zoning into conformity with the Apartment Neighbourhoods designation in the Official Plan. It will permit redevelopment of the existing Edenbridge Plaza at 25 Fontenay Court, with a mixed use condominium development that will be comprised of one 19-storey and one 12-storey apartment building linked by a 5-storey podium containing commercial space, apartment units and amenity space.

This proposal implements the Official Plan and is consistent with the requirements of the Provincial Policy Statement for urban intensification.

Summary

On June 26, 2008, the Committee of Adjustment refused an application for Consent to Sever the property at 742 Scarlett Road into 2 lots, and Minor Variance applications to permit demolition of the existing house and construction of 2 new two-storey houses (File Nos. A234/08EYK, A235/08EYK and B32/08EYK). Construction of the new houses required variances to the by-law standards related to lot frontage, lot area, lot depth and front yard setback.

City Planning Staff did not comment on the proposal but provided a lot frontage analysis of existing properties in the surrounding area to the Committee for information purposes.

Several residents appeared before the Committee in opposition to the application.

The agent for the applicant has appealed the Committee of Adjustment refusal decision to the Ontario Municipal Board. No hearing date has been scheduled.

In view of the refusal decision of the Committee of Adjustment, and the opposition to the development expressed by area residents, this motion is brought forward to authorize the City Solicitor to retain an outside planning consultant and to attend the Ontario Municipal Board hearing to oppose the applications and proposal.
