ISSUE BACKGROUND

Each year, the Homes nominate a resident for the Mary Ellen Glover Award for selection by the Advisory Committee on Homes for the Aged. Using the written description of the nominee's accomplishments and history with the Home, the recipient is selected. The Mary Ellen Glover Award is presented as part of the Excellence in Volunteering recognition ceremony. This year's reception will be held during National Volunteer Week on Friday, May 2, 2008 at 12:30 p.m. in the Members' Lounge and City Hall.

COMMENTS

Since its inception in 2003, the Mary Ellen Glover Award has been an important part of the Division's formal volunteer recognition program. In addition to the presentation made to the selected divisional recipient, the Homes are encouraged to host a special recognition to acknowledge the Home Nominee(s). This year, eight of the ten homes submitted nominees for consideration and selection by the Advisory Committee on Homes for the Aged.
