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Collection of Personal Information by City Licensed Second-Hand, Salvage Yard and Old Gold Dealers

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Recommendations

The Executive Director, Municipal Licensing and Standards Division recommends that:

- 1. The City of Toronto Municipal Code, Chapter 545, Licensing, be amended by adopting the amendments in Appendix "A", attached to this report; and,
- 2. The City Solicitor be directed to prepare the necessary bill to give effect to the recommendations in this report, effective immediately; and,
- 3. This report be forwarded to the next meeting of the Police Services Board for their information; and,

Financial Impact

The recommendations will have no financial impact beyond what has already been approved in the current year's budget.

Summary

This report addresses the issues raised by the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Ontario (IPC) regarding municipal by-laws which require the collection, recording and production of personal information from sellers of goods to Toronto licensed second-hand and salvage yard dealers and dealers in old gold and other precious metals and jewellery.

As a result of a complaint received on July 6, 2007, regarding the information collection practices of the City of Ottawa, relating to second-hand, the IPC conducted an investigation, which resulted in Order MO-2225 being issued to the City of Ottawa on September 11, 2007.

This Order directed the City of Ottawa and the Ottawa Police Service to cease requiring that second-hand goods shops collect certain pieces of personal information from individuals selling used goods to the shops. In addition, the IPC's Order required that those pieces of personal information that had been previously collected by the shops under the City's by-law be destroyed. This is the first time the IPC of Ontario has issued a cease collection and destruction Order under the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (*MFIPPA*), or its provincial counterpart.

This report recommends that similar provisions in the City of Toronto Municipal Code, Chapter 545, Licensing, as they relate to second-hand dealers, salvage yard dealers and dealers in old gold and other precious metals and jewellery, be amended to bring the Code into compliance with the Order issued to the City of Ottawa by the IPC.
