# Parking Regulations: Lytton Boulevard

# **SUMMARY**

This staff report is about a matter that the Community Council has delegated authority to make a final decision, provided that it is not amended so that it varies with City policy or by-laws.

To obtain approval to remove the on-street parking prohibitions on both sides of Lytton Boulevard, from Bathurst Street to a point 248 metres east thereof.

The removal of the parking prohibitions will address concerns regarding the lack of onstreet parking for residents.

# RECOMMENDATIONS

Transportation Services Division, North York District recommends that:

1. Schedule VIII of By-law No. 31001, of the former City of North York, be amended to delete the "No Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday to Friday" prohibition on both sides of Lytton Boulevard, from the easterly limit of Bathurst Street to a point 248 metres easterly thereof.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

All costs associated with the amendments of the parking regulations are included within the Transportation Services Division's 2008 Operating Budget.

## **ISSUE BACKGROUND**

Transportation Services Division, North York District, was requested by Councillor Karen Stintz, on behalf of residents, to remove the "No Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday to Friday" prohibition on both sides of Lytton Boulevard.

#### **COMMENTS**

Currently, parking is prohibited from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday to Friday on both sides of Lytton Boulevard, from Bathurst Street to a point 248 metres easterly thereof.

The parking prohibitions were initially installed in April 2004 at the request of the residents, to eliminate the weekday daytime on-street parking activity associated with the Bialik Hebrew Day School, located on the west side of Bathurst Street.

Since parking was prohibited in 2004, residents have had difficulty finding daytime parking and, as such, they would prefer to contend with the daytime parking generated by Bialik Day School.

It should be noted that parking will be permitted for a maximum of up to three hours on both sides of the roadway.

Councillor Karen Stintz supports the recommendations contained within this staff report.
