Dear Councillor Heaps,

I have noticed on the agenda for this evening's TCAC meeting that you will be discussing "Winter Snow Removal on Bike Lanes" (8:00 - 8:15pm).

I would like the committee to consider adding the Lakeshore bike lane to your list of options. This bike lane is a unique and precious gift to the residents of east Toronto, protected from City streets with its own traffic signalling. It is one of the most direct and safest bike routes in Toronto for cycling.

As an East End resident, I use the path to get into the downtown core whenever it is clear. During the winter, Beach and Leslieville residents are forced onto street bike lanes that are overrun with snow banks, creating a dangerous obstacle course for riders.

Keeping the Lakeshore bike route clear all year round would ensure safe travel to the many cyclists who choose to cycle/commute to work all year round. We hope you will give it a priority in your discussions today!
