Proposed Speed Limit Reduction on Lavery Trail

SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter for which the Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

This report provides the results of traffic studies conducted on Lavery Trail where a 40 kilometre per hour (km/h) speed limit is technically justified and recommended for implementation over the entire length of the subject roadway.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Transportation Services, Scarborough District, recommends that Scarborough Community Council:

- 1. Adopt the "40 Kilometre Per Hour" speed limit regulation, as identified in the Appendix 1 of this report.
- 2. Amend the appropriate by-laws accordingly.

Financial Impact

The financial cost of installing the posted speed limit signs is approximately \$1,500.00. Funding for the signs is available in the Transportation Services 2008 Operating Budget, within Cost Centre TP0397.

ISSUE BACKGROUND

Further to a request from staff at Meadowvale Public School, regarding speeding concerns on Lavery Trail near the school, Transportation Services staff reviewed the feasibility of reducing the speed limit from 50 km/h to 40 km/h on this roadway.

The justification for introducing a 40 km/h speed limit is based on the technical warrant for this purpose adopted for use in the City of Toronto.

COMMENTS

Several characteristics describing Lavery Trail are:

- The roadway is located in the community east of Meadowvale Road, and north of Ellesmere Road, within the Highland Creek neighbourhood.
- The land use on Lavery Trail is single family residential and elementary school use (Meadowvale Public School).
- Lavery Trail is a two-lane local road with a pavement width of 8.5 metres. It has an existing "default" unsigned 50 km/h speed limit.
- Sidewalks are located on one side of Lavery Trail.

40 km/h Speed Limit Warrant

Application of this warrant reveals that a 40 km/h speed limit is appropriate on Lavery Trail. Specifically, the "Pedestrian Environment" and also the "Road and Traffic Environment" categories of the 40 km/h Speed Limit Warrant are satisfied due to the presence of an elementary school adjacent to the roadway and two sharp curves on the road.

When installed, the 40 km/h speed limit will be consistent with the traffic environment of the community.
