

**Installation/Removal of On-Street Parking Spaces for
Persons With Disabilities - February 2008**

SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter which Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision. The purpose is to obtain approval for the installation/removal of a number of on-street parking spaces for persons with disabilities.

RECOMMENDATION

Transportation Services recommends that Toronto and East York Community Council approve the installation and removal of on-street parking spaces for persons with disabilities at the locations identified in the attached Appendix A.

ISSUE BACKGROUND

Transportation Services receives numerous requests for the installation and removal of on-street parking spaces for persons with disabilities. Some of these requests come directly from members of the public and others are received through the local Councillors' offices.

The installation of designated on-street parking spaces for persons with disabilities is a convenience provided for disabled persons and/or those who transport them, making it

easier for them to find available parking as near as possible to their places of residence or intended destinations and reducing the distance that the disabled persons must walk. Delays in installing these requested on-street spaces may create hardships for disabled applicants.

Timely removal of designated on-street parking spaces for persons with disabilities when these on-street spaces are no longer required is necessary in order to maximize available on-street parking for other residents/motorists.

COMMENTS

Transportation Services staff have investigated the feasibility of installing and/or removing on-street parking spaces for persons with disabilities at the locations identified in the attached Appendix A to this report. None of these sections of roadway are served by TTC transit routes.

For locations where on-street disabled persons' parking spaces are being established, all applicants are holders of valid disabled persons' parking permits issued by the Ministry of Transportation and each designated space will not result in the loss of more than one on-street parking space for general use. Locations where on-street disabled persons' parking spaces are to be removed are the result of applicants moving, holding expired permits or no longer requiring these on-street parking spaces.

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Appendix A

On-street parking spaces for persons with disabilities to be removed:

<u>Ward</u>	<u>Location</u>
29	Baltic Avenue, south side, between a point 7.3 metres west of Donlands Avenue and a point 5.5 metres further west.

On-street parking spaces for persons with disabilities to be installed:

<u>Ward</u>	<u>Location</u>
30	Booth Avenue, east side, between a point 84 metres north of Colgate Avenue and a point 5.5 metres further north.
31	Gates Avenue, south side, between a point 97 metres west of Chisholm Avenue and a point 5.5 metres further west.
32	Kew Beach Avenue, north side, between a point 46.4 metres east of Woodbine Avenue and a point 5.5 metres further east.
32	Wildwood Crescent, north side, between a point 132 metres east of Kingsmount Park Road and a point 5.5 metres further east.
