Thank you for the opportunity to speak on this issue.

The establishment located at 2183-2185 Danforth, known as the "The G-Spot", has served to be an issue with myself and my neighbours for many months now with respect to the excessive noise.

I have contacted Ms. Bussin's office in the past and appreciated the follow up.

I have also contacted the police on a few occasions as well as I felt the noise was carelessly excessive in the early hours of the morning. I do so with the recognition that this would not be a high priority call with Tor. Police and may not get dealt with, given their manpower situation but figured I would be remiss if I did nothing and openly encouraged my neighbors to do the same.

-It is enough that we have to close our windows in the heat of the summer in order to lessen the effect but still have to deal with feeling the base throughout the house.

-It is enough that my neighbor's and I now compare experiences from occasion to occasion as to how loud it was the night before.

I feel our summer has been robbed of peaceful enjoyment of our yard in the evenings because of our disdain for having to listen to the music which is time and time again serves only to illustrate the owner's disregard for those residents above, behind and around his business.

Given their demonstrated disregard for the immediate community around them I vehemently oppose any motion to expand this operation and it's accompanying opportunity to distance themselves from demonstrating responsible proprietorship
