 - B. Referred the presentation by the Scarborough Association of Seniors to the Scarborough Community Council on March 26, 2009 on the issue of illegal rooming houses and renting of second suites in residential dwellings, to the Planning and Growth Management Committee.
 - C. Requested:
 1. the City Solicitor and the Executive Director, Municipal Licensing and Standards, to report back to Scarborough Community Council on any additional measures that City Council can implement to enforce its by laws to regulate Second Suites in Scarborough.
 2. the Executive Director, Municipal Licensing and Standards, to report back to the Scarborough Community Council on the various rooming house definitions within Community Council areas which are more strict than Scarborough.
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3. the Executive Director, Municipal Licensing and Standards, to report back to the Scarborough Community Council on how second suites can be registered in the Scarborough area.

4. the City Solicitor in consultation with the Chief Building Inspector, to investigate the “City of Toronto Act” for provisions to allow entry by City inspectors to investigate illegal rooming houses and second suites and report thereon to the Planning and Growth Management Committee.
