# **Queens Avenue - Speed Limit Amendment**

#### SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter for which the community council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

The purpose of this report is to obtain approval to reduce the speed limit on Queens Avenue, between Lake Shore Boulevard West and Superior Avenue, from 50km/h to 40 km/h.

Given that there is a curve on Queens Avenue, a parkette at both ends of the road, and no sidewalks on the east side of the street along the frontages of the parkettes, a 40 km/h speed limit is recommended on Queens Avenue.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

# Transportation Services recommends that the Etobicoke York Community Council approve:

1. Enacting a 40 km/h speed limit on Queens Avenue between Lake Shore Boulevard West and Superior Avenue.

#### **ISSUE BACKGROUND**

Area residents have expressed their concerns on numerous occasions regarding the speed of vehicular traffic on Queens Avenue. As a result, Transportation Services has evaluated the need to lower the speed limit on this street. A map of the area is Attachment No. 1.

#### COMMENTS

Queens Avenue is classified as a local road and runs north-south between Lake Shore Boulevard West and Superior Avenue, east of Royal York Road. There are sidewalks on both sides of this road on the sections between Hillside Avenue and Superior Avenue, except for the section on the east side of Queens Avenue, south of Superior Avenue, where there is no sidewalk along the frontage of the parkette (Queens Park). With respect to the section between Hillside Avenue and Lake Shore Boulevard West, there is a sidewalk only on the west side of the street, thus there is no sidewalk along the frontage of Vimy Ridge Parkette located on the east side of Queens Avenue, north of Lake Shore Boulevard West. The pavement width on Queens Avenue is 7.2 metres.

The legal speed limit on this road is currently 50 km/h.

Land use on Queens Avenue is residential.

Our most recent speed study revealed an operating or 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed of 42 km/h on Queens Avenue between Lake Shore Boulevard West and Queens Avenue. The 85<sup>th</sup> percentile is the speed at or below which the majority of motorists feel comfortable travelling under the existing roadway conditions. The traffic volume on this road is approximately 600 vehicles per day.

Under the current Council policy, 40 km/h speed limits may be implemented on streets where Road Width and either Pedestrian or Road and Traffic Environment criteria are met. Although Queens Avenue does not satisfy the Pedestrian or Road/Traffic Environment criteria as set in **Appendix A – Table 1** attached, there are other compelling site conditions that impacts operational safety and that merits additional consideration. Specifically, there are the two aforementioned parkettes located on Queens Avenue and neither have a sidewalk located along their frontages. In addition, there is a curve in the street located at the south limit of the road.

Based on the aforementioned, staff recommends the reduction of the speed limit on Queens Avenue, between Lake Shore Boulevard West and Superior Avenue, from 50 km/h to 40 km/h.
