(d) Request for Traffic Calming at the Intersection of Braecrest Avenue and Westona Street (Ward 2 – Etobicoke North)

The Etobicoke York Community Council requested that staff re-examine area traffic patterns, volumes and speeds following build-out and occupancy of the seniors' retirement and housing facility at 2245 Lawrence Avenue West, and at that time consider alternate traffic management measures including permanent traffic calming devices.

(i) (August 19, 2004) from the Director, Transportation Services, West District, responding to a request from the Etobicoke York Community Council on July 6, 2004, to report back on the issue of installing a directional diverter or other traffic calming devices at the intersection of Braecrest Avenue and Westona street and to comment on establishing staging area for heavy truck traffic servicing the development site at 2245 Lawrence Avenue West; advising that the estimated cost of installing "Jersey" barriers across Westona Street at Braecrest Avenue is approximately \$4,000.00 which will have to be made available in the 2004 Transportation Services Capital Budget and would be subject to competing priorities and funding availability.
