PROPOSAL

This site is also referred to as 940 Lansdowne, 1100 Lansdowne or Davenport Village.

This land is also subject to an application under the Planning Act for site plan approval for phase three of the development to permit 84 stacked townhouse units, Application No.:08 188409 WET 17 SA.


If you wish to be notified of the adoption or refusal and/or of the decision of the City of Toronto in respect to the proposed Draft Plan of Subdivision, you must make a written request to the City Clerk, attention: Glenda Jagai, Administrator, Etobicoke York Community Council, at the address set out in this notice or by Fax: (416) 394-5600.

Plan of Subdivision Appeal: If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City Clerk, attention: Glenda Jagai, Administrator, Etobicoke York Community Council, at the address set out in this notice or by Fax: (416) 394-5600 before the proposed Plan of Subdivision is approved or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision to the Ontario Municipal Board and may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Municipal Board unless, in the opinion of the Board, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

People writing or making presentations at the public meeting: The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.

The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issue(s). If you are submitting letters, faxes, e-mails, presentations or other communications to the City, you should be aware that your name and the fact that you communicated with the City will become part of the public record and will appear on the City's website. The City will also make your communication and any personal information in it - such as your postal address, telephone number or e-mail address - available to the public, unless you expressly request the City to remove it.
